WHEREAS Terrell Tyrone Bryan (commonly known as TYRONE MAPP – professioanally as an architect and throughout his lawn tennis (tennis) career died on the 4th August, 2024 in Florida, U.S.A.

AND WHEREAS Tyrone was an outstanding and leading player in the 1960's and 1970's in Barbados, the Caribean, and in various circuits in and around New York, in the USA.

AND WHEREAS Tyrone represented Barbados in the now defunct Brandon Trophy (the then premiere Tournament) in the then British West Indies and subsequently played under the aegis of the Commonwealth Caribbean LTA

AND WHEREAS Tyrone continued playing tennis at various levels including in Veterans/Seniors with much success and recognition including winning several Veterans Brandon Events and participating in International Tennis Council Tournaments (both for the IC of Barbados and the IC of The Bahamas) worldwide including Belgium, Russia, U.K. Canada & the USA.

AND WHEREAS Tyrone served on the Council of the Barbados Lawn Tennis Association Inc. (now Barbados Tennis Association) in various capacities for many years including as a Vice-President and at his passing was an Honorary Life Vice-President.

AND WHEREAS Tyrone through his professional skill was extremely instrumental together with Bruce Hackett, Bertram Mahy, Jerry Date, and Peter Symmonds in submitting the Town Planning Permission and obtaining all necessary permissions/approvals for the establishment of the Tennis Centre

AND WHEREAS Tyrone designed the layout of the tennis centre with Club House and oversaw its ultimate construction.

AND WHEREAS Tyrone never stopped showing interest in tennis in Barbados or elsewhere in the Caribbean.

AND WHEREAS Tyrone often attended General Meetings of the Association and made important contributions when/where necessary.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Barbados Tennis Association recognize the outstanding, indelible and selfless contribution which Tyrone made to tennis in Barbados and to the Association and thus erect a suitable monument and/or a Bust of Tyrone, to be commissioned, accordingly and to be placed at the Tennis Centre or within the Honor Skinner Club House.
